HIGH SCHOOL SOPHOMORES & JUNIORS WASHINGTON YOUTH TOUR 2023

PURPOSE:

Each summer, Paulding Putnam Electric Cooperative sponsors one student from our membership that attends an Ohio or Indiana school for the annual Youth Tour trip to Washington, D.C. in June. Selected winners can learn about our nation's Capital, the government and rural electric cooperatives while seeing the historic and cultural sights of the Washington, D.C. area. Many tours are VIP visits to areas not available to the general public. More than 1,800 students from up to 46 states will travel to Washington for the weeklong experience. There is an opportunity for students to make life-long friendships and valuable contacts.

The program is coordinated by Ohio Electric Cooperatives (OEC) and Paulding Putnam Electric Cooperative (PPEC). All transportation, lodging, meals and admission costs are included. For safety considerations, a registered nurse, doctor and dentist are on call at the hotel at all times.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

To be eligible to compete for the Washington Youth Tour, the following provisions will govern the acceptance of applicants:

- Entrants must be the child or legal ward of a Paulding Putnam Electric Cooperative member. The account must be in the parent's name.
- Entrants must be a high school Sophomore or Junior or Senior at the time of application due date.
- Incomplete applications are ineligible. Applications must be received in the Paulding Putnam Electric Cooperative office by 4:00 p.m. on March 1, 2023. Incomplete applications are ineligible.
- The Youth Tour Committee and Entrants will be provided with the Cooperative Difference video link about electric cooperatives and the seven cooperative principals by which co-ops operate.
- Applicants will be asked to participate in a multiple-choice test included with the application.
 There is also a personal interview that will be scheduled with the Youth Tour Committee held at Paulding Putnam Electric Cooperative.
- Questions asked in the interview will include knowledge of cooperatives, specifically Paulding Putnam electric Cooperative, scholastic achievements and career goals.
- The committee will weigh responses based on content quality and presentation abilities.
- The selected delegate will be asked to be present in the award announcement at their home school. A runner-up will also be selected in the event the winning delegate cannot attend.

ONCE SELECTED AS A YOUTH TOUR DELEGATE

- One student will be chosen to represent PPEC on the all expense paid Youth Tour to Washington, D.C., in June. Winners will be notified and presented at their home school.
- Indiana Electric Cooperatives (IEC), or Ohio's Electric Cooperative (OEC) will follow up with the winning representatives and their parents via telephone and email.
- The candidate representing PPEC is strongly encouraged to compete during the Youth Tour for
 election to represent Ohio/Indiana on the National Rural Electric Association (NRECA) Youth
 Leadership Council. Well-qualified, well-prepared candidates who are friendly, outgoing, and
 positive have an excellent chance of being selected by their fellow students for this additional
 honor. Only one representative from each state is elected to the council. Information is available

- Representatives will be asked to return the following year to share their experience.
